

About Cornell College

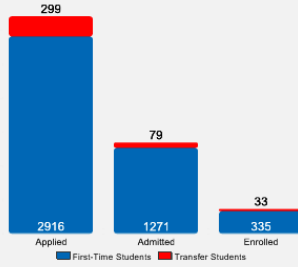

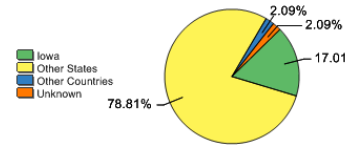

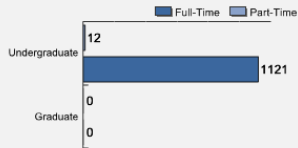
* While a standardized test score is required, Cornell places primary emphasis on academic performance and individual talents and interests in the admission review process.

Freshman Class Geographical Profile



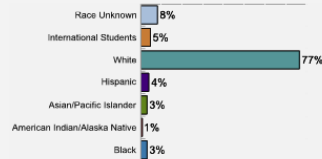

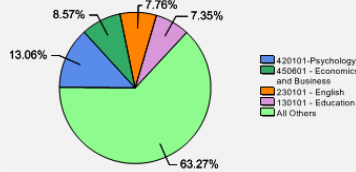

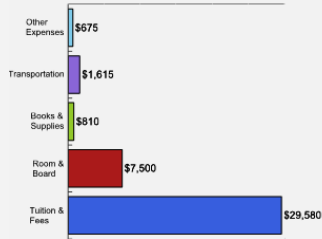

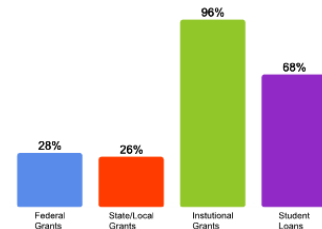

2008 Average Net Tuition for Aided Undergraduates *

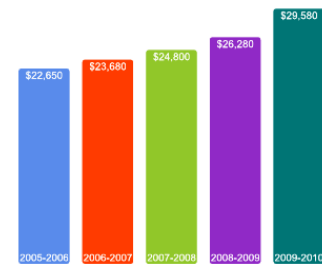
