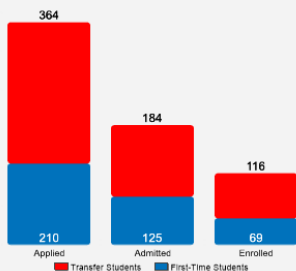

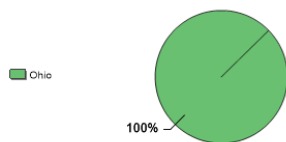

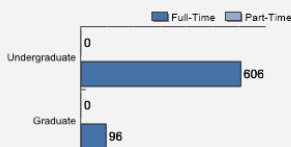

Fall 2018 Freshman Class Geographical Profile



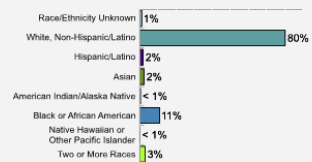
Fall 2018 Enrollment

Freshmen Returning For Sophomore Year: 64%

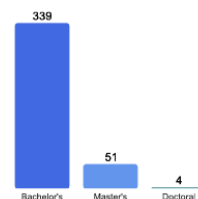
Percentage of Students Who Graduate

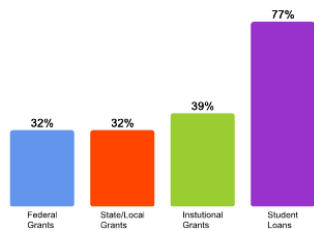

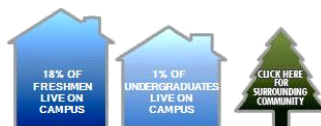
