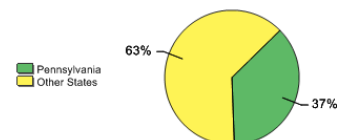

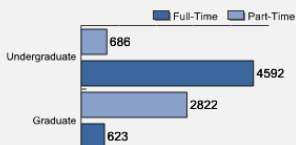

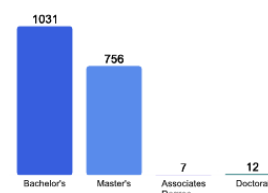

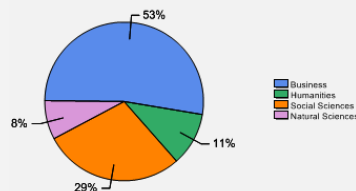

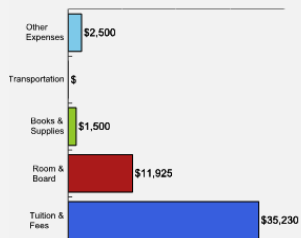

Price of Attendance in 2010-11

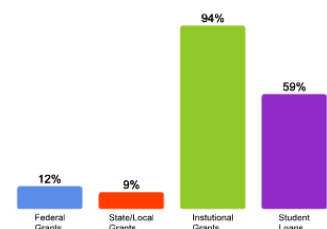


What it's Like on Our Campus

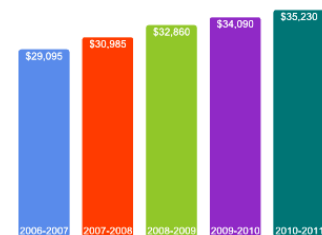
