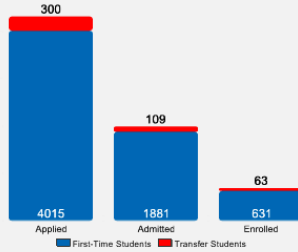

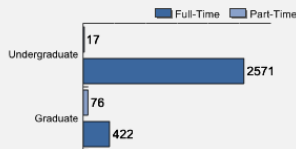

Average High School GPA of Freshman Class: 3.87

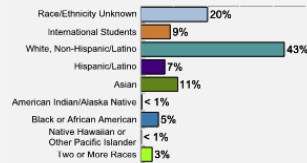
Fall 2010 Freshman Class Geographical Profile

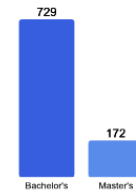

Bachelor's Degrees Awarded Last Year

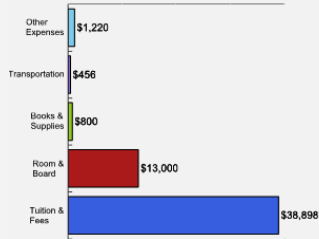

2009-10 Average Net Tuition for Aided Undergraduates *

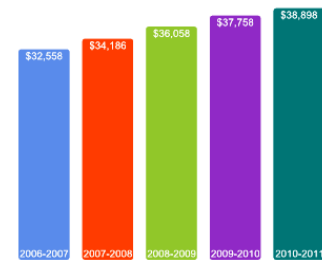
